# 8. OLD BUSINESS

### A. PUBLIC HEARING -ORDINANCE # 246 - MEDICAL MARIHUANA MORATORIUM

Mayor Winslow opened the Public Hearing at 6:12 p.m. stating the purpose of the public hearing was for the first reading of proposed Ordinance #246 which if adopted would impose a moratorium on the issuance of permits for the sale or dispensation of medical marihuana within the City of Standish.

Mayor Winslow asked for Public comments. Jody Wilk of 3381 Sterling Road, Omer, Michigan stated that she felt that the City should do what it could to prohibit any type of medical marihuana dispensary in the City of Standish.

Hearing no further public comment, Mayor Winslow closed the public hearing for Ordinance #246 at 6:17 p.m.

#### B. RECYCLING DISCUSSION/DECISION

Dan Garmin of Rewards for Recycling appeared before Council and gave Council a brief description of the Rewards for Recycling Program and also noted that he had spoken with representatives from the Arenac Opportunities that currently recycle paper and card board.

Residents present questioned the costs involved with the program as well as the participation factor as it related to those residents that wintered in another state. Residents also questioned if the recycling materials would need to be separated prior to pick up by the City's trash hauler. It was noted that no sorting of recycling materials would be required.

After discussion, is was **MOVED** by Reno to not approve the recycling program at this time with Sunrise Disposal and Rewards for Recycling and to have the City Manager look into a drop off site for City residents to deposit their recycling materials. The motion died for lack of support.

After further discussion, it was **MOVED** by Sanford and supported by Tunney to table any decision on the recycling issues and conduct a survey of residents for their input with the results to be brought back to Council at a later date. A roll call vote was taken.

# C. POLICE CHIEF SALARY DISCUSSION/DECISION

Mayor Winslow stated that when the police chief was placed in his current position, he was told that his salary would be increased commensurate to his position. Moran stated

that he had reviewed the budget and felt that the salary adjustment could be handled with the revenue received from the sale of the property to the Fire Authority along with expected revenue to be received from the traffic citations that will be written under the City's motor vehicle code.

MOVED by Sanford and supported by Ireland to increase the police chief's salary to \$39,000.00 per year effective July 1, 2010. A roll call vote was taken.

### A. MARY JOHNSTON LIBRARY - CHECK PRESENTATION

Mayor Winslow presented a check to Stephanie Olsen of the Iosco Arenac District Library and Hildegard Carruthers from the Mary Johnston Library in the amount of \$3695.00. Mayor Winslow stated that these funds were made possible by the Chippewa Tribe in their 2% summer distribution of gaming revenues. Winslow stated that the City applied for the 2% funds on behalf of the Library and that these funds would be used to upgrade the lighting in the Library.

## B. WEBSITE PRESENTATION

Michael Robb appeared before Council with a website presentation for Council to consider. Moran informed Council that the City's current website is outdated and in need of upgrades. Robb stated that his firm, Ohno Design, would be willing to design and work with the City to install a program that would allow City Staff to keep the information on the website current.

Sanford leaves the meeting at 7:15 p.m. Sanford returns to the meeting at 7:18 p.m.

Moran asked that the City Council move forward with this project to update the City's website and to use Mr. Robb and his firm, Ohno Design.
